Often called the Birthplace of Humanity, it is perhaps no surprise that the African continent is home to a vastly rich musical tradition whose influence can be found all over the world. It cannot be questioned that popular music such as blues, rock 'n' roll, gospel, jazz, pop and countless Latin styles would certainly never have evolved the way they did had African music not captured the imaginations of those it met on its voyage westward.

It is easy to see why it did. A journey through Africa will introduce you to some of the most charming musical instruments on Earth, such as the mbira (thumb piano), the kora (West African harp-lute) and of course its myriad drums, shakers and percussion instruments.

From the tradition of the ancient griots, the storytellers of western Africa, to the choral tradition of the southern African gospel singers and the folk songs of the Ugandan Nile, this collection highlights Sub-Saharan African music in its traditional and contemporary forms. 1. **Maqhawe 'Nkosi** – Dumisani "Ramadu" Moyo EUCD1704 Ramadu – Izambulelo – Traditional and contemporary music from Zimbabwe Licensed 2000 from Dumisani 'Ramadu' Moyo, Graz/Austria.

Ramadu, former lead singer of the Zimbabwean group *Insingizi Emnyama*, presents a varied album from traditional a cappella songs with excellent harmony singing and accompanied songs with traditional drums and percussion to modern African music. Info about the songs plus original lyrics in the booklet.

"The mixture of background music and voices create a wonderful sound of "isicathamiya" (Ladysmith's special style of harmony singing) – Joseph Shabalala, head and lead singer of Ladysmith Black Mambazo.

2. **Njala** – Bomas of Kenya EUCD1996 Tribal Dance from East Africa Licensed from A. I. Records, Kenya.

This album presents traditional tribal songs, rituals and dances from various regions in Kenya, accompanied on traditional instruments, such as the *kayamba* (raft rattle), *mumanga* (thumb piano), *isanu* (gourd trumpet) *irimba* (thumb piano), *bells*, *marimbas* and more. Information in English, German, French and Spanish explaining the backgrounds to the music.

3. Imbukula – Jackson Ingosi EUCD2030 Spotlight on Kenyan Music – also featuring: Suzzana Owiyo, Achien'g Abura Licensed from A.I. Records (Kenya) Ltd. UK | Published by EMI Music.

Contemporary songs from Kenya, rooted in East African musical tradition, sung in Kiswahili, Kikamba, Luhya and other local languages. The album gives a taste of the rich variety of musical traditions and styles which have influenced the songs performed. Also featuring Suzzana Owiyo, Achien'g Abura and more...

4. **Reng Ya Lenyalo** – Serankure Music Arts EUCD2132 Ancient Civilisations of Southern Africa 3 – The Tswana People Licensed from Clear Music, South Africa.

This excellent album presents traditional and contemporary music and rhythms of the Tswana peoples (Botswana and surrounding areas). There are a cappella songs accompanied with *clapping* and *ankle shakers*, pieces with huge *marimbas* (xylophones) playing intricate rhythms and melodies, and more. Traditional *drums* and various other *percussion*, *clapping* and *shouts* are all part of the feel.

5. **Sihamba Nawe** – Johnny Clegg EUCD2038 Tribal Beatz of Africa – Yelengu – featuring Barry Van Zyl, Robin Hogarth, Johnny Clegg... Licensed from Clear Music, Johannesburg, South Africa.

A wonderful combination of traditional rhythms and percussion from around Africa, combining the energy and pulse of tribal beats with the talents of some top modern day African musicians and singers. Featuring a track written and performed by Johnny Clegg.

#### 6. Ngazengayibona

EUCD2243 Voices of Southern Africa, Vol. 2 – Insingizi An ARC Music production.

Following the amazing worldwide success of their first album, the Zimbabwean vocal group *Insingizi* present fourteen new songs, a cappella or accompanied with African drums, clapping, whistles...

She was elected *Best New Artist* at the *Jazz and World Music Festival* 2000, Vannes, France. Her music covers a wide spectrum from traditional (with traditional instruments) to modern.

#### 9. **Fall**

EUCD2485 Africa Moo Baalu – Sousou & Maher Cissoko Licensed from Jaliya Connection, Sousou & Maher Cissoko.

Gorgeous, goosebumps-creating music with intimate vocals and virtuoso *kora* playing backed by *guitar, double bass* and *percussion*. Truly soulful music that will bring you to a peaceful place of your heart.

10. **Karamoja Childrens' Song** – field recording in Uganda by David Fanshawe, 1969 EUCD1793 Music of the Nile – Recordings by David Fanshawe Licensed from Fanshawe One World Music, UK. | @ & © Fanshawe One World Music, UK.

A musical journey along the Nile from Cairo to Lake Victoria containing pure, original African field recordings, from Egypt, Sudan, Uganda and Kenya, recorded between 1969 and 75. Anecdotes and extensive info about the pieces illustrated with stunning photographs.

#### 12. Mambo Bado

EUCD1909 Legends of East Africa – The Original Recordings – Orchestra Makassy Licensed in 2004 from A. I. Records (Kenya) Ltd., UK | Published by EMI Music.

The long awaited re-release on CD, of the original 1982 recordings of Orchestra Makassy's stellar album *Agwaya*. Plus two never before released tracks. The booklet features some of the original lyrics in Swahili, Shona and Lingala with English explanations plus info about Orchestra Makassy in English, German, French and Spanish.

13. **Afö** 

EUCD2489 Afro-Mandinka Soul, Tama-Silo – Seckou Keita Quartet Licensed from Seckou Keita.

Seckou Keita presents his Quartet with West African kora, a host of African drums and percussion, double bass, Egyptian violin, riti (fiddle), n'goni (lute), cajon. Beautiful, soothing, almost hypnotic music.

14. **Amashiki!** – Amagugu Akwazulu EUCD2340 Traditional Zulu Music – Songs of King Shaka Licensed from Clear Music, South Africa.

Songs from King Shaka's time (1785–1828) including songs in his praise, war cries of the Zulu impi (army), hunting songs, celebration songs and other traditional songs from the times of the early Zulu kings. Sung a capella, accompanied by stamping, clapping, whistling, etc.

17. **Summertime** – Black Umfolosi EUCD2386 Best of Black Umfolosi – Summertime Licenced from Black Umfolosi.

Black Umfolosi present a collection of their most beautiful and inspiring traditional songs from their native southern Africa. Imbued with a great gentleness of spirit, intricate rhythms, energy driven, engaging songs and a beauty and enthusiasm that is unrivalled. Featuring the renowned *Nkosi Sikelela* and *Imbube (The Lion Sleeps Tonight)* as well as their most recent hit *Summertime*.

18. **Mambo** – Bushmen of the Kalahari EUCD1995 Bushmen of the Kalahari Licensed from Clear Music, South Africa.

This album documents the almost extinct Bushman culture in Southern Africa. Extensive documentation in the 40-page booklet with amazing colour photographs. Bushmen shaman healing rituals, hunting songs, rain-making songs, tracking songs, a spoken history of the Qwii... accompanied on authentic self-built instruments by some of the last Bushmen of the Kalahari Desert.

#### 20. **Ulele**

EUCD2396 Vocalism – Vusa Mkhaya Licensed from Vusa Mkhaya Ndlovu for Mkhaya Music Production.

From the African musical traditions that shaped him, to the fresh and modern touches that identify him: Zimbabwe's Vusa Mkhaya tells his story through 'Vocalism'. A 'Making of' video – watchable on your computer – is included on the CD.

#### 21. **Neo** EUCD2432 My Africa – Elemotho Licensed from R. G. Mosimane, Namibia.

Winner of the 2012 RFI – France 24 Discoveries Award. Namibian-born Elemotho presents a remarkable album of original songs, sung in his native tongue, Setswana, English and other Namibian languages. His music (*guitars, bass, drums, flute, percussion, vocals*) has a touch of rhythms from the Kalahari Desert, mixed with ethnic and global sounds, the 'calling of the rain' combined with emphatic messages for our modern times.

#### 22. Yebo Africa Shosholoza

EUCD2442 Gondwana Dawn – Africa and India: United in Music and Harmony – Robin Hogarth & Sumitra Guha Licensed from and Published by Clear Music, South Africa.

From the swirling mists at the dawn of time come the ancient hymns of the Veda, and the spirituality of Africa. *Gondwana Dawn* combines an African youth choir and music with Indian songs, traditional skilled instruments and voice. This album takes us into a unique new world of spirituality, music and rhythm: India and Africa united in music.
